motivation

Barriers to support seeking and providing

Desire to create positive impressions and save "face"

Difficult to disclose stigmatized experiences, often associated with negative impressions Social support: potential outcome of disclosure

Miscarriage is often: stigmatized, traumatizing, associated with negative well-being, challenging to identity, not socially acknowledged as a loss that deserves to be grieved Unsupportive reactions to miscarriage disclosers
